Jesus didn't make disciples this way.



I have joined a cohort group for the Bonhoeffer Project. We meet on the third Thursday of the month and will meet for ten sessions. The group is studying what it means to make disciples the Biblical way. Over the years, the church has drifted away from a Biblical understanding of what it means to be a disciple.

This picture was used in discussing how churches see discipleship. This is not how Jesus did discipleship. He entered into people's lives and had them follow him. They shared life and learned through the interaction of each other.

At some point, the church decided we needed to have classroom settings and learn about Jesus. Church became more about something we do than who we are called to be. The church is not a building but the people who meet in a specific place. The people are the church.

When someone says that a particular style of worship or the look

of a building doesn't feel like church, what are they saying? Is it the people who are not friendly? The people don't look like the people they usually worship with on a Sunday. Church is who you are. The bride of Christ. Most countries where Christianity is persecuted heavily meet in homes or underground structures. What, then, would they say when they would walk into our sanctuary? This doesn't feel like church. No, they wouldn't because they know it is about the people around them. They share life. They are walking after Jesus with each other, holding each other up, and walking together through life following Jesus.

We have lost this idea that we are the church, and it is also because we have lost what is the Gospel. In my cohort, we have been talking about what the Gospel is and what Gospel you preach. The book *Conversion and Discipleship: You Can't Have One Without the Other* by Bill Hull talks about the six Gospels that are preached today. The one that is preached the most is what Bill calls the Forgiveness Gospel. This Gospel teaches grace and forgiveness but never mentions repentance or following Jesus. This Gospel says you are forgiven to spend eternity in Heaven, nothing else. There is no growing in the faith. No following the example of Jesus. The person following this Gospel will show up on a Sunday morning, and that is it. There is no fruit from their life with Christ. No need to help anyone else. No taking care of the sick, the widows, and the orphans. This is part of the Gospel, but it is not the whole Gospel. It leaves out the follow me portion of what Jesus says.

Another Gospel that enters into the American church is the prosperity Gospel. You have to have faith, and God will give you all you want. This creates a person who is only concerned about themselves but also leaves a void if something horrible happens. There is no relying on God to help get you through the bad of your life. This is not biblical, either. The book of Acts blows this idea out of the water. The disciples had some of the most remarkable faith and were still beaten and locked up.

Finally, the Gospel of Jesus, or as the book calls it, the Kingdom Gospel. The Kingdom Gospel is the proclamation of the rule and reign of Christ over all of life. Bill Hull says that the way to enter this kingdom has always been the same. "Jesus has invited us to follow him, and he is the entrance to the kingdom. So start walking. We enter by accepting him as our rabbi and our king. We agree to learn from him by following his teaching, submitting to his direction, and praying for his help and provision. As we do, we grow to know him and love him, and through the work of the Holy Spirit, we start to become like him" (C&D page 39). If you believe the Forgiveness Gospel, that is great, but there is more to it. You are known as a disciple, an ambassador, a representative of Jesus on earth. How you live and act in all areas of your life shows others where your heart lies.

Showing up on a Sunday doesn't mean much if every other day is lived apart from the Kingdom of God. Yes, belief in Jesus gets you into Heaven, but He also calls you to DO. We don't DO to be saved because that has already been done for us. We DO because we are saved. That is what the Kingdom Gospel says. Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men. Follow Me is what Jesus said to all his disciples. He is saying to you now, as a disciple, Follow me. That doesn't mean sitting and discussing what follow me means. It means follow me through life with others, and I will show you Heaven already here. It is not something for the future only but something for right now, right here, right where you are. There will be others with you as well. Come, Follow Me.

I would like to thank everyone for their prayers during my recovery from my heart attack. I believe that God hears our prayers.
