The tabernacle model was donated to our church by Mrs. Theodore Moran, Sr. in 1979. She dedicated many hours researching the details to create an accurate representative. The students were able to see up close the tabernacle including the Holy of Holies, the twelve tribes, and the Arc of the Covenant.

Mrs. Moran's goal was to provide a teaching tool that would help future generations understand God's promises to His people. How exciting that 46 years later, our Sunday school program is fulfilling her wishes.

If you would like to see the students' work on the tabernacle, it is on display in the hallway past the senior high room near the church safe.

Pipe Organ

According to history written in the First Presbyterian Church 125th Anniversary Booklet (1950), a dedication of the new pipe organ occurred on February 17, 1929. The organ had been remodeled and rebuilt at a cost of \$7,252. A program of organ music was offered at both the morning and evening services by Mrs. Pau E. McMichael, organist and Herman Stahl, the builder of the organ. At the time of dedication, it was one of the finest and largest organs in Western Pennsylvania.

Special Service

On Sunday, May 21, 1961, a "Service of Moving Into and Consecration for Worship of the New Sanctuary" occurred. The pastor was Marshall D. Berryhill. (Several current members of FPC may remember this service.)

1931-1932 Yearbook

In The Year Book of the First Presbyterian Church for 1931-1932 there were 12 Group Divisions listed of Woman's Guild. The women of the church who wished to be a part of the Woman's Guild were divided into monthly groups with the names of the groups being the months of the year from January - December.

- Kids of the Kingdom preschool (KOK) is thriving and has a full enrollment of 24 students. March is also the beginning of accepting applications for next year.
